ow, what a year 2014 has been for Nabholz! We've celebrated our 65th anniversary and experienced some amazing growth opportunities. I personally have enjoyed my first year as CEO, travelling to our offices, visiting our jobsites, and connecting with great clients. After my travels and meetings, I am reassured that our team is committed to our purpose of growing our people, serving our clients, and building our communities—all with the highest level of integrity.

I am excited to report that 2014 revenues increased to \$421.4 million, up from \$357 million in fiscal year 2013. 2014 was a record year for Nabholz in terms of work acquired, and our backlog is up 89% over the previous year. Most importantly, I am proud to say that Nabholz was profitable for the 65th year in a row. All of this adds up to a very strong start going into 2015 and gives me great confidence in our future success.

Our firm has a strong balance sheet, ZERO debt, and a bonding capacity in excess of \$750 million. What gets me really excited, though, is hearing how happy our team members have made our clients. Year after year, our team continues to deliver excellent customer service and increased value for clients, shareholders, and Nabholz employees.



Our service and emergency specialty teams had another impressive year. In 2014 they managed over 5,500 projects in 27 different states. Their ability to provide superior service, maintenance, and small project expertise of all kinds continues to be a significant differentiating factor for Nabholz. Our outstanding service teams are the reason our clients know Nabholz isn't just there to do one big job and move on, but to be a long-term partner, serving their complete facility needs. Thanks to our service team members' hard work and dedication that vision is now reality.

2014 has been a transformative year for our millwork operation, which remains one of the region's largest and most technically advanced millwork shops. Starting with a complete LEAN evaluation of the shop, our team reconfigured both the layout and fabrication processes and invested in a new computer-aided CNC router, all to reduce waste and increase productivity and quality. The result? A 40% increase in productivity!

The biggest highlight for millwork in 2014, though, is another year with ZERO accidents, making 2014 their fourth consecutive accident-free year! Nabholz installed a 290-foot-long drag chain conveyor that was suspended 55 feet above the floor through the center of the client's existing facility. The team also replaced an existing conveyor outside the building and tied it into the new conveyor inside.

City of Tulsa, Oklahoma Cherry Creek Expansion & Upgrade

This project consisted of demolition and expansion of an existing flow equalization basin, including substantial earthwork, concrete structures, a new parking area, environmentally friendly lighting, and new pavement. The project also includes relocating a portion of the heavily traveled Riverside Bike Trail, along with the installation of three new underground valve vaults, new telemetry and process controls, upgrades to an existing Lift Station, installation of new manholes and various ductile iron yard piping, up to 36" inches in diameter. The work is scheduled to be complete in 2015.



Highway 62 from Avoca to Garfield

Rogers, Arkansas This project, scheduled for completion in Summer 2015, will widen a six-mile stretch of U.S. Highway 62 from three lanes to five lanes.


ENVIRONMENTAL
